In July 2010, Bill will lead an expedition of young adults (with and without hearing loss) to the Peruvian Amazon as part of the Global Explorers and Hear the World partnership.

No matter what obstacles we face in life, Bill Barkeley may just give us all the inspiration to persevere; come and be inspired.

What Children with Cochlear Implants Need at School

Thursday, 8:30 a.m. – Noon

Presenters:

Donna L. Sorkin, M.A., vice president, Consumer Affairs, Cochlear Americas;
Jessica Melton, Au.D., CCC-A, clinical applications specialist, Cochlear Americas

Designed for school professionals and parents of children with hearing loss, the presenters will review key topics that can help achieve a favorable classroom environment and provide guidance for the regular classroom teacher. Although the focus will be on children with cochlear implants, some of the content is relevant to the needs of any child with hearing loss. Among the topics to be addressed are:

- FM systems
- Classroom acoustics
- Best practices for teachers in the classroom
- Roles of various team members including classmates

The workshop fee of \$50 includes entrance to the HLAA Exhibit Hall on the afternoon of the workshop as well as the Opening Session. This workshop is free to those registered for the full convention. aids, cochlear implants, services in the school system in their respective communities, and suggestions on how to work with school officials to obtain an appropriate education for their children of all ages. Learning how others have worked with their children to develop good communication skills and how to cope with the effects of a child's hearing loss on the entire family will be discussed. Laws that impact on the child's education and their right to appropriate access will be presented.

All parents, grandparents, and older-aged children are welcome to attend. **There is no additional fee for this workshop.**



A complete list is available on the Convention page but a few highlights on the list are:

The **Betty Brinn Children's Museum** is Milwaukee's only interactive hands-on museum just for kids ten and under and their parents and caregivers. It encourages hands-on learning and the development of fundamental skills, self-esteem, and the ability to work with others. Visit www.bbcmkids.org for more information.



The **Boerner Botanical Gardens** is an internationally renowned horticultural showplace in the Milwaukee County Parks, offering gardeners and plant lovers the opportunity to take in the colors and scents of a variety of collections. See www.boernerbotanicalgardens.org for more information.

Discovery World is unlike any museum you've ever seen—it includes interactive science, technology and freshwater exhibits, learning labs, theaters, television and audio studios, and fresh and saltwater aquariums. Located along the shores of Lake Michigan, it is home to the S/V Denis Sullivan, a 137-foot replica of a 19th century Great Lakes schooner and a floating classroom for water education and conservation programs, and day and night sails. The **Milwaukee Art Museum's** extensive collection includes nearly 20,000 works from antiquity to the present. The Museum's permanent holdings include important collections of Old Masters and 19th- and 20th-century art. Important artists represented include Winslow Homer, Auguste Rodin, Edgar Degas, Claude Monet, Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec, Pablo Picasso, Georgia O'Keeffe, and Andy Warhol.

The 341,000-square-foot Museum is an architectural landmark, comprised of three buildings designed by three legendary architects: Eero Saarinen, David Kahler, and Santiago Calatrava. Most fascinating is the Burke Brise Soleil, a moveable sunshade with a 217-foot wingspan that unfolds and folds twice daily. See www.milwaukeeartmuseum.org for more information.
